

Mission

- publishing **textbooks and study materials** (for the academic courses available at UNG),
- research and scientific works and also
- professional books, fiction and other works

We encourage higher education teachers, researchers and all involved in the educational process at UNG to publish their original works also at UNG Press.

Main conditions

- all works must go through the publishing process determined by the UNG publishing rules (
 Pravila o založniški dejavnosti Univerze v Novi Gorici)
- each work must be reviewed by two reviewers (one must be external)
- reviewers must be approved by the publishing commission of UNG
- each work must undergo a linguistic revision
- the publication proposal with a financial plan must be approved by the rector before publication

Brief history

- 2001: University of Nova Gorica started its publishing activity and the first publishing rules were adopted (Pravila o založniški dejavnosti Politehnike Nova Gorica)
- 2002: first textbook was published
- untill 2015 we published: 30 printed books and 2 e-books (on CD-ROM) (textbooks, proceedings books, scientific monographs & 1 fiction)
- at the end of 2013 publishing rules (Pravila o založniški dejavnosti Univerze v Novi Gorici) were updated → option to publish under a Creative Commons license has been added

Open Access (OA) publications

- **2015:** first two e-books were published in **OA** under CC license:
 - 1. proceedings book Škrabčevi dnevi 8
 - 2. textbook Modeliranje dinamičnih sistemov ...
- untill 2024 we published: **24 books in OA** (textbooks, proceedings books & scientific monographs)
- in 2024 no. of all <u>OA books</u> published exceeded the number of traditionally published books currently available at UNG Press



Traditional vs. OA publications by years



OA requirements for monographs

- researchers should ensure open access also to scientific monographs and other types of peer-reviewed publications co-funded by public resources to the extent of at least 50% (
 Uredba o izvajanju znanstvenoraziskovalnega dela v skladu z načeli odprte znanosti, 2023)
- publishers of scientific monographs who are recipients of public funds for scientific research activities must provide free access to online editions of (co)funded scientific monographs (Javni razpis za (so)financiranje izdajanja znanstvenih monografij ARIS)

Licensing requirements

- scientific publications: CC BY, CC BY SA
- monographs and other long text formats also:
 - ✓ CC BY-NC,
 - ✓ CC BY-ND or
 - **✓ CC BY-NC-ND**

Creative Commons (CC) licenses

- created to make it easier to share knowledge
- more liberal principle of "some rights reserved" opposed to "all rights reserved"
- free, easy to use, legally enforceable, world-known, and last for as long as the valid copyright and similar rights
- an **internationally valid license**, which allows authors to specify under what conditions they allow their works to be used

Four different elements of CC licenses

- **BY (Attribution)**: credit must be given to the creator
- SA (Share Alike): adaptations must be shared under the same terms
- NC (Non Commercial): only noncommercial uses of the work are permitted
- ND (No Derivatives): no derivatives or adaptations of the work are permitted

Different combination form six different licenses

- 1. <u>CC BY (Attribution)</u>
- 2. CC BY-SA (Attribu en are Alike)
- 3. CC BY-NC (Attribution Non Conmercial)
- 4. CC BY-ND (Attribution No Derivatives)
- 5. CC BY-NC-SA (Attribution Non Conmercial Share Alike)



6. <u>CC BY-NC-ND</u> (Attribution – Non Commercial – No Derivatives)



What you should consider before you apply a CC license

- all licenses are **non-revocable**: you can't change or cancel the license later
- **no control: who** will reuse your work and **how** (especially for more permissive licenses)

When using more restrictive licenses you should be aware

Non-Commercial licenses (CC BY-NC and CC BY-NC-SA):

- your work can't appear on any website with advertising content
- prevent commercial use without permission: in order to make commercial use, user must obtain permission from the copyright holder (usually publisher not the author!)

No Derivatives Licenses (CC BY-ND and CC BY-NC-ND):

- revent modifications: also **prevent translations**
- >some remixes are still possible: copyright's exceptions and limitations (quotation, review, criticism, to illustrate an idea or provide an example in another larger work)
- in order to make adaptation, user can ask for permission from the copyright holder (usually publisher not the author!)

Advantages of publishing your work under open licenses (CC BY, CC BY SA)

- your work can be published anywhere, translated, updated, revised, modified and adapted for different purposes
- is more likely to be preferred among users
- leads to more visibility for you and more impact for your work, a better return on investment for funders, and greater access to knowledge for other researchers and the general public

Using someone else's OA work

- 1. check the terms of work's CC license
- 2. include the following information: **title** of the work, **author** (username), source link (**URL**), **copyright** and **licensing** of the original work
- 3. only use work from creators you have full confidence in and keep a clear record of the licenses (take screen shots)

Remember

If you would like **to obtain additional permissions** to use the work beyond those granted by the CC license that has been applied, or if you're not sure if your intended use is permitted by the license, **you should contact the rights holder**.

Publish a book with Pressbooks

Online platform designed to create and publish books on the public web:

- it is easy to publish, collaborate, adapt, and share digital books
- you can add videos, multimedia, quizzes and other interactive activities
- you can share your content in multiple formats (HTML, E-Pub, PDF etc.)
- you can adapt openly licensed content from Pressbooks Directory (more than 7000 available) and begin editing
























Adapting OER with Pressbooks

- a large number of diverse and high quality OER are freely available
- adaptation or adoption of OER will almost always be more efficient than creating teaching materials from scratch
- one of the biggest advantages: it gives you the legal right to add to, adapt, or delete the content of the textbook to suit your course needs without obtaining permission from the copyright holder

More reasons to adapt OER


- adapt the material to meet a cultural, regional, or national preference
- adjust for a different grade or course level or learning style
- correct errors or inaccuracies
- update the book with current information
- add more media or links to other resources
- translate the material into another language etc.
